Summary

1, Several specialized care facilities for adults with CHD have been established by the physicians who were trained in the North American or European established centers in Asian Pacific Region, but the number of specialists and facilities for ACHD is still small in spite of the growing number of patients.

The team approach in this field is necessary, however, that is not well organized in most institutions.

2, Education and training systems for adult CHD are still lacking in most Asian-Pacific countries at this point.

3, Future collaboration among Asian Pacific countries and international societies are mandatory.
